
#### **OPENING PRAYER**







Reader: (Letter to the Philippians 1: 21-30)


Brothers and sisters, For to me, living is Christ and dying is gain. If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labour for me; and I do not know which I prefer. I am hard pressed between the two: my desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better; but to remain in the flesh is more necessary for you. Since I am convinced of this, I know that I will remain and continue with all of you for your progress and joy in faith, so that I may share abundantly in your boasting in Christ Jesus when I come to you again. Only, live your life in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that, whether I come and see you or am absent and hear about you, I will know that you are standing firm in one spirit, striving side by side with one mind for the faith of the gospel, and are in no way intimidated by your opponents. For them this is evidence of their destruction, but of your salvation. And this is God's doing. For he has graciously granted you the privilege not only of believing in Christ, but of suffering for him as well since you are having the same

struggle that you saw I had and now hear that I still have.

The celebrant burns incense.

Cel: Peace ★ be with you.

And with your Spirit.

From the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Saint Matthew, who proclaimed life to the world. Let us listen to the proclamation of life and salvation for our souls.

The celebrant incenses the Book of Gospels three times. Meanwhile, the deacon proclaims:

Deacon/Cantor: Remain silent, O listeners, for the Holy Gospel is about to be proclaimed to you. Listen, and give glory and thanks to the Word of the living God.

Cel: (Matthew 5: 13-17)

'You are the salt of the earth; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything but is thrown out and trampled under foot. 'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father

in heaven. 'Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfil.

# **Homily**

#### **Profession of Faith**

We believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

We believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. We confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and we look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Cong: The Lord reigns clothed in majesty. Alleluia!

Our Lord Jesus said: "I am the Bread of Life.

Priestly hands now lift me high above the altars."

The Celebrant raises the paten in his right hand and the chalice in his left, saying:

Cel: Almighty Lord and God, you accepted the offerings of our ancestors. Now accept these offerings that your children have brought to you out of their love for you and for your holy name. Shower your spiritual blessings upon them and, in place of their earthly gifts, grant them life and your kingdom.

Amen.

The Celebrant places the offerings on the altar and covers them with the palls. He extends his hands in the form of a cross upon them, saying:

Cel: As we remember our Lord God and Savior Jesus Christ, and his plan of salvation for us, we recall upon this offering all those who have pleased God from Adam to this day, especially Mary, the blessed Mother of God, Saint Maron, Saint N. (the patron of the church), and Saint N. (the saint of the day).

Remember, O God, the children of the holy Church: our fathers and mothers, and our brothers and sisters, both the living and the departed, especially those for whom this sacrifice is offered, N. Remember also all those who share with us today in this offering.

Amen.

Grant us the peace that your only Son gave to his holy disciples, so that we may give one another that same peace with a holy kiss. We raise glory to you, to your only Son, and to your Holy Spirit, now and for ever.

Cong: Amen.

The Celebrant places his hands on the altar and on the offerings and then he gives the greeting of peace.

Cel: Peace to you, O Altar of God. Peace to the Holy Mysteries placed upon you. Peace to you, O server of the Holy Spirit.


Deacon: Let us give the greeting of peace to our neighbor

Cong: And with your spirit.

Cel: (lifting up his hands and looking upwards)

Let us lift up our thoughts, our minds, and our hearts.

Cong: We lift them up to the Lord.

Cel: (joining his hands and bowing)


Let us give thanks to the Lord with reverence and worship him with humility.

Cong: It is right and just.
Cel: (extending his hands)

Father of Mercies, Lord of creation, Lord of the universe, unsearchable God, you are the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, your beloved Son, born of you and equal to you. He is the radiance of your glory, the image of your being and, by your power, the maker of all. In him you created the world in your grace. In him we see you, and from him we receive your Spirit. In him the mystery of the Trinity, hidden from all ages, was revealed. We praise and thank you with our mouths that have been blessed by your word and cleansed with your forgiving hyssop.

Those who glorify you are countless: cherubim and seraphim, thousands of spiritual beings standing before you, and myriads of fiery ranks serving your majesty. They sing triumphant hymns with harmonious voices. O Lord, although we are your weak and sinful children, make us worthy, through the gift of your grace, to sing with them and proclaim:

Cel: Glory to you, God the Father, for you have exalted our human nature through your grace. In your abundant mercy, you sent your beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, into the world. He came down to us and by the Holy Spirit became flesh of the Virgin Mary, accomplishing all things for our salvation.

Cel: (taking the bread in his hands and praying in Syriac)

Cel: (taking the chalice in his hands and praying in Syriac)

Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is my blood of the new covenant, which will be poured out and given for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins and for eternal life.

Cong: Amen.

The Celebrant bows.

#### Cel: (extending his hands)

Do this in memory of me. For whenever you gather in my name, and eat this bread and drink this cup, you remember my death and resurrection until I come again.

Cong: We remember your death, O Lord.

We profess your resurrection.

We await your second coming.

We implore your mercy and compassion.

We ask for the forgiveness of sins.

May your mercy rest upon us.

Cel:

O Lord, we now remember all that you suffered and endured for us, and your liberating and life-giving plan of salvation: your miraculous incarnation, your saving passion, your life-giving cross and your life-giving death, your solemn burial, your joyous resurrection, your ascension into heaven, your sitting at the right hand of the Father, and your second coming when you shall reward all people according to their deeds. O Lord, have compassion and pour out your mercy upon all of us, that we may enjoy the gifts of your heavenly Church. For this, your Church implores you and, through you and with you, implores your Father, saying:

Cong: Have mercy on us, Almighty Father.

Cel: (crossing his hands over his chest)

O Lord, as we, your sinful children, receive your graces, we thank you for them and because of them.

How awesome is this moment, my beloved, for the living Holy Spirit descends and rests upon this offering for our sanctification. Let us stand with reverence as we pray.

Cel: (bowing, he flutters his hands three times over the Mysteries)

Hear us, O Lord, that the gates of heaven may be opened, revealing that place of glorious light. May your Holy Spirit come, descend, and rest upon us and upon this offering, that it be for the pardon of faults and the forgiveness of sins for those who share in it.



# Cel: (joining his hands)

We offer you, O Lord, this sacrifice, the memorial of your passion, crucifixion, death, and resurrection, for your Church throughout the world. She is founded on your hope, remembers your salvation, and awaits your kingdom. We offer it for the bishops of the true faith. Grant them the wisdom and knowledge that comes from you, and make them worthy to proclaim your kingdom, especially, Francis, the Pope of Rome, Bechara Peter, our Patriarch of Antioch, and Gregory and Elias our Bishops. May all the shepherds of the Church sanctify their days by caring, in fear and justice, for your people that you have entrusted to them. We pray to you, O Lord.

Cong: Lord, have mercy.

Deacon: Remember, O Lord, the priests and deacons here and everywhere who serve diligently

and are vigilant over their flocks. May they receive their reward.

Remember those who have taken vows of chastity and holiness, who keep their bodies and thoughts pure, that they may triumph in their efforts. We pray to you, O Lord.

Cong: Lord, have mercy.

Deacon: Remember, O Lord, our civil leaders who love you, and all those whom you wish to

govern us. Strengthen and assist them, so that we may live in peace under their leadership. Crown them with true faith and good works. We pray to you, O Lord.

Cong: Lord, have mercy.

Deacon: Remember, O Lord, the children of the Church, redeemed by your passion and given

life by your death, for they share in your resurrection; those who are far and those who

are near, those who are weak and those who are strong.

Remember those who have presented these offerings upon your holy altar, and accept them on your heavenly altar. Hear their just requests, and in exchange for their earthly

gifts grant them the gifts of heaven. We pray to you, O Lord.

Cong: Lord, have mercy.

Deacon: Remember, O Lord, in your grace, those whom we have remembered and those whom we have not. In your mercy have compassion on them.

Remember especially those in distress who experience hardships; the poor, the weak, and the grieving, those in exile, captives and prisoners, the oppressed, outcasts and the dejected, orphans and widows. Remember those bound by the chains of sin and subjected to various passions. Through your Body and Blood, may their sins be forgiven, their faults be pardoned, their weaknesses be cured, and their wounds be healed. We pray to you, O Lord.

Cong: Lord, have mercy.

Deacon: Remember, O Lord, in your great mercy, our fathers and patriarchs, the teachers of your holy Church who were pleasing to you from the beginning. By the glorious light of their teachings, they brought people back from the darkness of ignorance to the true light of the holy Gospel, and they fought to preserve the integrity of the true faith. Through their holy prayers, grant peace to your churches, monasteries, and convents,

and put an end to wars and strife throughout the world.

We pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, have mercy. Cong:

Deacon: Remember, O Lord, all your saints, especially Mary, the holy and ever-Virgin Mother

of God, the prophets, apostles, martyrs, confessors, and all who professed the Trinity in true faith. Through their holy prayers and petitions, look upon us with eyes of compassion, and may your calming and pleasant face shine upon us. Make us worthy to share in their reward and their inheritance, and may their shadow be a shelter of

protection for us on the fearful day of judgment. We pray to you, O Lord.

Deacon: Bow your heads before the God of mercy, before his forgiving altar, and before the Body and Blood of our Savior, who gives life to those who partake of him, and receive the blessing from the Lord.

Cel: (extending his hands)

O Lord, we have approached your holy altar, the source of divine gifts. May we share in your Holy Mysteries and join the assembly of those who glorify you, that we may raise glory to you, now and for ever.

# Prayer for Spiritual Communion

During the time of communion, recite the following in place of receiving physical communion: O Divine Ocean of Mercy and Compassion, be with us in our time of trial and difficulties. Today I make an act of spiritual communion with you, the Life-Giving Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. At this time I am not able to receive the sacred body and blood of my Lord, God and Savior Jesus Christ, but I choose to live in union with him and in the unity of the Holy Spirit. I offer my day, my daily life, my joys and sorrows to you, for those around me, and for the whole world. Be with us O life-giving Triune God, for we know that nothing in this world has power over us. O Lover of all people, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

The Celebrant consumes what remains of the Mysteries and performs the ablutions. Meanwhile, the congregation sings an appropriate thanksgiving hymn.

We thank you, O God, Father of great mercy, and we praise and glorify you for having made us worthy of your holy banquet and of sharing in your life-giving Mysteries. We implore you, do not condemn us on that fearful day, but deliver us from shame and disgrace, that we may join the assembly of your saints, so that with them and among them.

we may raise glory to you, to your only Son, and to your Holy Spirit, now and for ever.

Cong: Amen.

Cel: (blessing the congregation)

+ Peace be with you.

Cong: And with your spirit.
Cel: (extending his hands)

O Christ, King of Glory, we entrust our lives to you, knowing that you will take care of our needs. Help the elderly with your mighty power, restrain the young with your guidance, nurture children and instruct them in your divine teaching, and sign each of us with your victorious cross. To you be glory, with your Father and your Holy Spirit, now and
